

# Blessing for Washing Hands Before Eating Bread

Take a cup and fill it with water.

Pour water onto your right hand twice and your left hand twice.

Then say the following berakha as you are drying your hands:

## Blessing over Wine & Grape Juice

How to say the blessing over wine and grape juice:

1) Fill your Kiddush cup with wine or grape juice.
2) Place the Kiddush cup in the palm of your hand and hold it high in the air.
3) Sing or say the blessing!
