

HOW TO SHAKE THE LULAV! Temp e Beth Sholon





- Pick up the LULAV in your RIGHT hand and the ETROG in your LEFT hand with the PITOM (stem) facing DOWN. Hold your hands together.
- Say the Following Berakha:

Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu

בַּרוּדָ אַתַּה ה' אֵלהֵינוּ

melekh ha-olam, asher

kid'shanu b'mitzvotav vitzivanu

קדשנו בִּמִצְותַיו וְצְוַנוּ

Mitzvot add holiness to our lives and who gives us the Mitvzah

al n'tilat lulav.

על נטילת לוּלב.

If this is the first time you are saying the blessing over the Lulav & Etrog this year then say:

Barukh atah Adonai. Eloheinu

Praised are you God

Melekh ha-Olam, she-heheyanu

Ruler of the universe who kept us in life.

v'kiy'manu v'higi'anu laz'man ha-zeh.

sustained us, and helped us reach this joyous occasion.

- 3. After you say the berakhot, turn the ETROG so that the PITOM (stem) is facing up.
- 4. The Lulav is then shaken in 6 different directions—

Facing East:

Forward, Right, Back, Left, Up, Down (To shake the Lulav "down," hold the Lulav facing to the sky and lower your hands slightly while you shake in this direction)

OR

East, South, West, North, Up, Down Want to remember which way to shake? Try this: Eat Some Wet Noodles Upside Down!!

5. Smell the ETROG!!

The Four Species symbolize a person!

The Lulav represents the spine of a person.

- 1. What have you done during the year that makes you stand up with pride?
- 2. Who are the people who supported you during the past year?

The Myrtle represents the eyes.

- 1. Think of the seasons; what have you seen in nature during the year?
- 2. Think of something beautiful that you have seen a person do during the past year.

The Willow represents the mouth

- 1. If you could thank God for one thing over the year, what would you say?
- 2. What are the best words to say and to hear?

The *Etrog* represents the heart

- 1. Who are the people who you love?
- 2. What happened over the past year that filled your heart with love?
